CITY OF LOS ANGELES EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT DEBUTS FIVE STEPS TO NEIGHBORHOOD PREPAREDNESS PROGRAM

Los Angeles, CA - The City of Los Angeles Emergency Management Department (EMD) announced today its Five Steps to Neighborhood Preparedness program, an easy-to-use guide for creating a neighborhood-wide disaster preparedness plan along with a series of upcoming community preparedness workshops to be held throughout the City.

To introduce residents to the program, which is designed to help them better prepare for disasters and emergencies, the City has scheduled four FREE community workshops. Refreshments and a raffle with door prizes are provided. Registration is limited. Here are the dates and locations:

- Wednesday, September 17, from 6:30-8:30 PM, at the Cheviot Hills Recreation Center
- Thursday, September 18, from 6:30-8:30 PM, at the Alpine Recreation Center
- Wednesday, September 24, from 6:30-8:30 PM, at the Sunland/Tujunga Municipal Building
- Thursday, September 25, from 6:30-8:30 PM, at the Crenshaw Christian Center

At the core of the award-winning Five Steps to Neighborhood Preparedness program, is the Five Steps Toolkit which enables individuals to define their neighborhood, rally and engage community members, and build a customized disaster response plan. This toolkit is inclusive of people with disabilities, those whose primary language may not be English, and others who may need extra help after a disaster, in order to help provide for the safety of all, in time of emergency.

“All of us are greater than any one of us,” said James G. Featherstone, General Manager of the City of Los Angeles’ Emergency Management Department. “The Five Steps to Neighborhood Preparedness program is designed to empower communities to not only address the unique issues they may face in case of an emergency, but create a plan to manage an emergency situation safely and effectively.”
